About this trip

Since their discovery in 1535, the Galápagos Islands have been intriguing explorers and scientists for centuries. Discover firsthand the fascinating biodiversity, volcanic terrain, and geological history that make the islands so compelling. This 11-day program includes visits to landmarks like Chinese Hat, Dragon Hill, the Twin Craters, and the red sand beaches of Rábida Island, plus the chance to see the remarkable wildlife for which the islands are known. With no natural enemies present, the animals throughout the archipelago are abundant, and have virtually no fear of humans. Accompanied by an expert naturalist guide, you'll learn about the forces, both natural and human, that have shaped the Galápagos Islands through the years.

Your students will...

- Come face-to-face with the iconic wildlife of the Galápagos, including Blue-footed Boobies, marine iguanas, Darwin's finches, and the Galápagos Penguin.
- Discover fascinating geological history while trekking volcanoes and lava fields.
- Enjoy daily opportunities for optional swimming and snorkeling to view the underwater life of the islands, such as fish, sea turtles, rays, and more.
- See rare endangered tortoises at the Charles Darwin Research Station's Fausto Llerena Breeding Center.
- Hike to the summit on Bartolomé Island for spectacular views of Pinnacle Rock, one of the archipelago's most recognizable features.

Itinerary

BLD = BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER

DAY 1 - QUITO

Upon arrival in Quito, after clearing customs and immigration, you will be met and escorted to your hotel. Arrival into Quito should be on a Wednesday for the Friday cruise departure. *Overnight at Hotel Cruz Loma.*

DAY 2 - QUITO

After breakfast this morning take a city tour of Quito, including a visit to the Middle of the World Monument. Enjoy traditional Ecuadorian food at a local restaurant for lunch. Please note you may substitute the city tour and visit to the monument with a full day excursion to Otavalo market, Cotopaxi National Park, Antisana Reserve, or Bellavista Cloud Forest Reserve for an additional cost. *Overnight at Hotel Cruz Loma. (BLD)*

DAY 3 - GALÁPAGOS

Fly from mainland Ecuador to Baltra. After boarding M/C Tip Top II or V, attend your first orientation and have a light snack. After lunch, disembark on Mosquera Islet, a reef of rocks and coral and a great white sand beach. Observe colonies of sea lions, Brown Pelicans, Blue-footed Boobies, and Sally Lightfoot crabs. Each night during the cruise there will be an orientation to discuss the events of the day and the next day's plans. *Overnight aboard Tip Top II or V. (BLD)*

DAY 4 - GALÁPAGOS

After breakfast, go ashore at Sullivan Bay on Santiago Island, a perfect place to get a feel for the volcanic origin of the islands. Look for new plant growth among the two distinct types of lava, pahoehoe and a'a. Return to the boat for lunch, followed by an excursion on Rábida Island, distinguished by its red sand beaches. Here you can observe marine iguanas, sea lions, Blue-footed Boobies, Masked Boobies, and Brown Pelicans. Walk to a small saltwater lagoon where you can see Galápagos Flamingos. *Overnight aboard Tip Top II or V. (BLD)*

DAY 5 - GALÁPAGOS

Today visit Espinosa Point on Fernandina Island to observe a large colony of sea lions, marine iguanas, Flightless Cormorants, and clumps of lava cactus. In the afternoon, take a panga boat ride around the islets of Elizabeth Bay to look for marine iguanas, marine turtles, seabirds, shorebirds, herons, Galápagos Penguins, and Blue-footed Boobies. Tonight attend an orientation to learn about conservation efforts to protect the islands. *Overnight aboard Tip Top II or V. (BLD)*

DAY 6 - GALÁPAGOS

This morning disembark on Isabela Island at Urbina Bay, a coral area at the base of Alcedo Volcano with land iguanas, Flightless Cormorants, and giant tortoises. Return to the yacht for lunch. In the afternoon, take a panga ride around Tagus Cove, located between the shoulders of two volcanic craters, which protect it from the open sea. Observe marine iguanas, sea lions, and a variety of birds, including Galápagos Penguins, Flightless Cormorants, and Blue-footed Boobies. *Overnight aboard Tip Top II or V. (BLD)*

DAY 7 - GALÁPAGOS

After breakfast, land at James Bay (Puerto Egas) on Santiago Island to walk and observe sponges, snails, hermit crabs, a variety of shore birds, barnacles, the endemic four-eyed blenny, marine iguanas, and sea lions. Visit Bartolomé Island in the afternoon to hike to the summit. During the hike, it's possible to observe colonies of marine iguanas and lava lizards, and on the summit you'll see an impressive view of the surrounding islands, including the eroded tuff cone of Pinnacle Rock, one of the most iconic sights in the archipelago. *Overnight aboard Tip Top II or V. (BLD)*

DAY 8 - GALÁPAGOS

After breakfast, land on Chinese Hat (Sombrero Chino), a small island off the coast of Santiago Island. Here you can observe Galápagos Penguins, eagle rays, sea lions, and marine iguanas from the rocky shoreline. This afternoon land at Dragon Hill on Santa Cruz Island, where you can see land iguanas and walk to a hypersaline lagoon (saltier than the ocean) to observe flamingos, Common Stilts, White-cheeked Pintails, and other bird species. *Overnight aboard Tip Top II or V. (BLD)*

DAY 9 - GALÁPAGOS

After breakfast, disembark and take the bus to the highlands of Santa Cruz Island for a visit to the native forests and the Twin Craters, two formations caused by the collapse of surface material caused by underground fissures. Then, visit a local farm where you can see giant tortoises in the wild and have lunch. Return to Puerto Ayora. Visit the Fausto Llerena Breeding Center and Interpretation Center inside the Charles Darwin Research Station. Return to the yacht for dinner and nightly orientation. *Overnight aboard Tip Top II or V. (BLD)*

DAY 10 - QUITO

After breakfast take an early morning walk along the coast and the interior of North Seymour Island, a low, flat island that was uplifted from the sea by underground seismic activity. Observe Blue-footed Boobies, which nest from May to November, as well as marine iguanas, pelicans, frigatebirds, shore birds, sea lions, and the endemic palo santo trees. Return to the yacht and navigate to the pier, where you'll disembark at 9 am. Your guide will accompany you on the bus ride directly to the airport. A small snack will be served on the flight. Enjoy the afternoon in Quito at leisure before gathering for a farewell dinner at the hotel this evening. *Overnight at Hotel Rincón de Puembo. (BD)*

DAY 11 - DEPARTURE

Today you will transfer to the airport for your flight home. (B)
