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About this trip

Connecting the ecosystems and civilizations of two continents, Panama is an ideal classroom for examining topics of biology, culture, engineering, and more. Compare rainforest and cloud forest habitats while observing neotropical wildlife. Spend the day with an indigenous tribe to learn about their way of life. Analyze the lasting effects of the country's early colonial roots, its role in World War II, and the construction of the famed Panama Canal. Finally, discuss how modern Panamanians are looking ahead to a sustainable future.

- Delve into the country's history on a stroll through the parks and colorful streets of Casco Viejo, Panama City's historical center.
- Gain a deeper understanding of the engineering marvel that is the Panama Canal during a visit to the Miraflores Locks Visitor Center.
- Enjoy fun adventure activities, including whitewater rafting, kayaking, and guided rainforest and cloud forest hikes.

Itinerary

BLD = BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER

DAY 1 - PANAMA CITY

Upon arrival at Tocumen International Airport you will be met by a Holbrook representative from Panama and transferred to the hotel. No meals included today; arrivals are in the evening. *Overnight at Radisson Panama Canal.*

DAY 2 - BOQUETE

After breakfast receive a program orientation, and then check out of your hotel and transfer to the airport for your flight to David. Upon arrival in David, visit a sustainable coffee farm and learn about pollination and sustainable farming. Continue to your hotel, where you will have dinner. *Overnight at La Casa de la Abuela. (BLD)*

DAY 3 - BOQUETE

Today embark on a thrilling whitewater rafting experience on the Chiriqui River. Experienced guides will provide training in safety procedures and gear usage before you set out on your rafting trip with level I and II rapids, perfect for beginners. This evening, listen to a lecture before dinner at the hotel. *Overnight at La Casa de la Abuela. (BLD)*

DAY 4 - GAMBOA

Early this morning take a guided cloud forest hike. Learn about public land conservation while you look for flora and fauna like orchids, howler monkeys, sloths, hummingbirds, and the Resplendent Quetzal. After your hike, return to the hotel for lunch and time to freshen up. Transfer back to David for your afternoon flight to Panama City and continue to Gamboa Rainforest Resort. *Overnight at Gamboa Rainforest Resort. (BLD)*

DAY 5 - GAMBOA

This morning the adventure begins with a transfer to the shores of Lake Alajuela, where members of the Emberá community will be waiting with their handmade dugout canoes to embark on the 30- to 60-minute boat ride (time depends of water level in the river). The paddle is through virgin rainforest where a variety of wildlife lives. Be on the lookout for herons, egrets, ospreys, toucans, parrots, turtles, caimans, sloths, otters, and monkeys. If the water level is high enough you can stop at a local waterfall for a quick dip on the way to the village. Upon arrival receive a traditional greeting of music and a fascinating presentation by the Emberá about their history, culture, and way of life. After the presentation, feast on a delicious lunch of fresh fish, fried plantains, and local fruit. After lunch, take a 20- to 30-minute hike with one of the village elders to learn about their medicinal plants. Finally there is free time in the village to look at or purchase any of their exquisite hand-woven baskets, plates or masks made from palm leaf fibers or Cocobolo wood (rosewood) or Tagua nut carvings, get a cultural temporary tattoo, swim in the river, play with the Emberá children, interact with the villagers or take pictures. The visit ends with a display of shamanic and celebratory music and dancing by the villagers. After the dancing it is time to say goodbye and return by boat to transfer back to Gamboa. Overnight at Gamboa Rainforest Resort. (BLD)

DAY 6 - GAMBOA

This morning visit Pipeline Road, a famous birding route in Soberanía National Park, where 385 bird species were once identified in just 24 hours. Begin with a walk along the road for birding en route to the Panama Rainforest Discovery Center, where there are numerous ongoing scientific investigations related to bird monitoring and conservation. Explore the visitor center trails in search or hummingbirds and a variety of colorful, tropical birds that live in the various layers of the rainforest canopy. Hike to the almost 100-foot observation tower and climb up for a bird's-eye view of the forest. Have lunch back at the hotel. Afterwards visit the Pan American Conservation Association. Learn about wildlife rescue and rehabilitation, transitioning injured animals back into the wild, animal relocation during canal expansion, and meet their animal ambassadors. This afternoon, go kayaking on the Chagres River. After dinner meet with Yaguara Conservation to learn about the plight of the jaguar and measures taken to replenish the wild cat population. *Overnight at Gamboa Rainforest Resort. (BLD)*

DAY 7 - PANAMA CITY

This morning after breakfast there will be a lecture on Colonial Panama, then explore the historical wonders of the city. The first stop will be Casco Viejo or Casco Antiguo, built in 1671 after the destruction of Panama Viejo by the English privateer Henry Morgan. Casco Viejo's parks and narrow streets are lined with colorful buildings representative of Spanish, French, and early American architectural styles. After lunch in the city visit Biomuseo's permanent exhibition, titled "Panama: Bridge of Life." The museum's eight galleries and eight "devices of wonder" explain the origin of the Panamanian isthmus and its gigantic impact on the planet's biodiversity. Later experience the wonders of the Panama Canal during a visit to the Miraflores Locks Visitor Center. This evening have dinner and attend a folkloric show at a local restaurant. *Overnight at Radisson Panama Canal. (BLD)*

DAY 8 - DEPART

Transfer to the airport for your flight home. *(B)*
