Are you ready for the Serengeti? This trip of a lifetime features six full days and nights within Tanzania's oldest and most important national park. Our late June tour occurs after the season of long rain has ended and wildlife viewing conditions are optimal. We will cross the Serengeti slowly from east to west in safari vehicles, then return by small airplane to Arusha town. Unlike typical Tanzanian safari tours, we've built in optional guided walking opportunities most days. Or use this time for rest and relaxation — you decide. Together, we'll learn about Tanzanian culture from our expert local guides as we visit a local primary school and a Maasai village home. Sharon & Kevin will be at your service to help you enjoy each day and expand your views of Africa.

ITINERARY

(BLD = BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER)

JUNE 14 - ARUSHA

Upon arrival at Kilimanjaro International Airport, you will be greeted and transferred to our comfortable hotel. Most flights arrive in the evening. No organized activities or meals are planned for this day. *Overnight at Arusha Serena Hotel*.

JUNE 15 - ARUSHA

Our professional local safari guide-drivers will provide a warm welcome and introductory orientation before we set off exploring. Our first full day in Africa will be a combination of wildlife-viewing drive and walking safari. Arusha National Park is nearby and provides excellent chances to see flamingos, giraffes, zebras, antelopes, and monkeys. An armed park ranger will accompany our safari walk, with views of Mount Kilimanjaro (19,340'). Overnight at Arusha Serena Hotel. (BLD)

JUNE 16 - LAKE MANYARA

Load up in the comfy Toyota Land Cruisers. We begin our overland, west-northwest journey toward Serengeti. We'll enjoy an exciting wildlifeviewing drive in the famous Lake Manyara National Park. We should have numerous encounters with wildlife, including baboons, buffaloes and tree-climbing lions. Lake Manyara is a birding hotspot home to gray-crowned cranes, hornbills, sunbirds, rollers and barbets. Our park visit will include a picnic lunch and a traverse across Tanzania's only canopy walkway. Overnight at Suricata Boma Lodge. (BLD)

JUNE 17 - NGORONGORO

With a slower pace today, we delve into the rich culture of Tanzania. We'll meet Maasai villagers at their homes to learn about their traditional lifestyle and observe students in the classroom at Lucas Mhina Primary School. Proceeds from international tourism helped fund the creation of this school. In the afternoon, we enter Ngorongoro Crater Conservation Area and get our first glimpse of Africa's most spectacular caldera. Upon arrival at our lodge, there will be an optional 90-minute rim walk. Or choose to relax in your room with a view of the crater. *Overnight at Ngorongoro Serena Safari Lodge. (BLD)*

JUNE 18 - NGORONGORO

We start early today with the thrilling descent into Ngorongoro Crater. The largest, intact volcanic caldera on Earth is brimming with wildlife. This promises to be one of those days you will remember clearly for the remainder of your life. We'll spend the full day driving in the crater with good chances to see hyenas, black rhinoceros, wildebeests and ostriches, oxpeckers and Marabou stork. You'll have a picnic lunch, to make the most of your day, not returning to your lodge until late afternoon. *Overnight at Ngorongoro Serena Safari Lodge. (BLD)*

JUNE 19 - EASTERN SERENGETI

Between the Ngorongoro and Serengeti, we'll visit the Olduvai Gorge overlook for a brief outdoor lecture about the work of Louis and Mary Leakey and the many discoveries here that helped elucidate the long history of extinct human species. Then we enter the scintillating Serengeti. The great migration of wildebeests, zebras and gazelles occurs in a clockwise direction across the Serengeti and parts of Kenya. Following the migratory herbivores are the charismatic carnivores: lions, cheetahs, hyenas and scavenging vultures. Our afternoon wildlife-viewing drive will curve around scenic kopjes, ancient rock islands in a sea of grass. *Overnight at Serengeti Sametu Camp. (BLD)*

JUNE 20 - CENTRAL SERENGETI

Serengeti, "the endless plains," is Tanzania's oldest national park and a World Heritage Site. Today our guide-drivers will transport us slowly across the plains. The scenery is breathtaking, the wildlife abundant. Patrolling the Seronera River Valley we could encounter elephants, leopards, lovebirds and bustards. Gather around the campfire tonight, as Kevin & Sharon will talk about the ecology of the Serengeti and we'll have a mid-trip species list review. Overnight at Land of Nature Camp. (BLD)

JUNE 21 - CENTRAL SERENGETI

Rise before the sun for a memorable visit to the hippopotamus pools. After breakfast we'll enjoy some relaxation time in our luxury safari tents, or around camp before an optional midday walk and afternoon wildlife-viewing drive. We'll enjoy an afternoon wildlife-viewing drive with sundowner beverages on the endless plain and toast our health, good fortune, and the preservation of wild Africa. *Overnight at Land of Nature Camp. (BLD)*

JUNE 22 - CENTRAL SERENGETI

Additional wildlife-viewing drives and birdwatching today will be planned around animals and landscapes that we haven't yet encountered. For travelers desiring to splurge for a hot air balloon experience, this can be arranged at additional cost and with advance confirmation. The balloon tour includes approximately 50-70 minutes of flight time, followed by a Champagne bush breakfast. Easy afternoon today to catch our breath before moving tomorrow. *Overnight at Land of Nature Camp. (BLD)*

JUNE 23 - WESTERN SERENGETI

The scenery changes today as we shift to the more vegetated riverine corridors. With all likelihood, thousands of wildebeests, zebras and gazelles will cover the savannah. We'll have an option to stretch our legs with a short walk after arrival at our third and final Serengeti camp. *Overnight at Kirawira Serena Camp. (BLD)*

JUNE 24 - WESTERN SERENGETI

Today's wildlife-viewing drives will focus on the Grumeti River crossings, where Nile crocodiles lie in ambush. For folks interested in more walking, there will be an evening walking option from camp. *Overnight at Kirawira Serena Camp. (BLD)*

JUNE 25 - ARUSHA-DEPARTURE

This morning, we bid farewell to Serengeti with a scenic flight across northern Tanzania. Upon our return to Arusha, we'll have a day room at a comfortable hotel with a fitness center. Decompress at the property or, time-allowing, take a guided city walk. An early dinner at the hotel will be provided before transfer to Kilimanjaro International Airport. Extensions to visit other parts of Tanzania can be easily arranged, if desired. Otherwise, it's out of Africa and safe travels home. *Day room at Four Points Sheraton. (BD)*

LAND COST

\$11,500 per person

Includes all activities, accommodations (11 nights, plus day room on final afternoon) and activities as indicated in the itinerary, all transportation in Tanzania including a flight from Grumeti airstrip to Arusha, expert local guide-drivers, bottled water. Includes all tips except for your guide-drivers. Includes transfers to and from Kilimanjaro International Airport. Does not include international airfare.

Cost is based on a minimum of 7 participants. Cost is based on double occupancy; for a single room throughout the tour add \$1,500. A \$500 per person non-refundable deposit is required to hold your space on the tour. Full payment is due by February 14, 2027. Cancellations after this date are non-refundable.
